## Teachers – How to Get Started

Step 1: Get an Ed Ready Teacher Account

  - Your Name
  - Your school or district email address
  - Identify that you need a teacher account
  - Which test(s) you would like to have made available for your students
- You will receive an email from <u>support@orvsd.org</u> once your account is set up. It will include your temporary password
