What is Early Childhood Services?

Early Childhood Services is a program of Southern Oregon Education Service District. Our staff of specialists in early childhood development and special education works with families to provide individually designed, family focused services to infants, toddlers and preschoolers with special needs. Our classroom environments and curriculum are designed to meet the unique developmental needs of both typically developing children and those with special needs. We believe all children benefit from playing, learning and having fun together.

We work closely with other agencies that serve children with special needs. These agencies include the Child Development & Rehabilitation Center, Family Friends Day Treatment Center, Children's Resource Team and Head Start. In conjunction with Regional Services for Low Incidence Disabilities, we provide services to children with autism, vision, hearing or orthopedic impairments and significant health conditions.
