## FREE Consultation Support for Child Care Centers, Family Child Care Homes, and School-Age Programs

*The Warm Line is a FREE program to offer assistance and consultation to support quality, inclusive child care and education for all children, birth through school age, including those experiencing disabilities, challenging behaviors, or special health care needs. Early educators and parents who have concerns or questions on how best to support a child in their care should contact the Warm Line.*

### Types of support:

- ◆ Resources, recommendations, information, and specific strategies to respond effectively to the array of challenging or concerning behaviors children may exhibit.
- ◆ Ideas and suggestions for making accommodations or adaptations to the child care environment to create inclusive classrooms.
- ◆ Training opportunities on a range of topics related to child development, child care environment, challenging behaviors, assessment, and inclusion.
- ◆ Assistance on engaging parents as partners and sharing difficult messages.
- ◆ Information on services and resources available through other agencies.
