2019-21 HUB BUDGET AND INVESTMENT PRIORITIES

- René advised that Focused Child Care Network is moving from Hub to Child Care Resource Network effective October 1, 2019.
- Copies of the following documents were shared:
 - o SOELS Funding Streams 2019-21
 - René explained that the funds listed for Preschool Promise are only for year 2019-2020 and shared that some providers will contract directly with ELD or ODE and not with the Hubs for the second year of the biennium.
 - The Hubs will still be responsible for technical assistance and professional development details still to come.
 - Other hub funding streams had little or no change for year one of this biennium. The business tax created from The Student Success Act will begin generating revenue in January 2020 and additional early learning funds will be available beginning in July 2020. The hub funding formula for this additional funding is not yet known.
 - Southern Oregon Early Learning Services Hub Investment Priorities for 2019-2021
 - René explained that she will complete the Alignment with Raise Up Oregon column and share with the group at a later meeting.
 - Chelsea explained Protective Factor Kits which the Hub purchased for participating partners using KPI funds. Those receiving the kits agreed to take the Strengthening Families training.
 - The Hub will continue to support the CCRN Warmline using School Readiness funds.
 - The Hub plans to contract with a professional to gather data and has budgeted \$25,000 to that effort.
 - The Hub is hosting No Small Matter screening at Inn at the Commons on October 30, 2019, as a kick-off event to engage the community in discussion and efforts to support the early learning workforce.
 - The Hub will be adding a facilitator to help support Early Care and Education Expansion planning.
 - We need to elevate Parent Voice in the region. To that end, funds to cover stipend and mileage and child care reimbursement will be provided. This will be in alignment with SOESD policies.
