### OREGON BECOMES 1<sup>ST</sup> STATE TO ADOPT CEPPS

Rep. Pam Marsh (D-Ashland) has successfully passed a resolution by the Oregon Legislature to make Oregon the first state in the country to adopt Childhood and Early Parenting Principles (CEPPs) as a framework for action by state agencies involved in Early Childhood Development.

On May 17, 2019, the legislature passed Joint Resolution 15, adopting [CEPP'S 7 Principles](#) “as a framework for strong and effective policies and programs for early parenting and early childhood development.”

The inspiration for the resolution came from Southern Oregon Success, Southern Oregon Early Learning Services (SOELS) and the Health Care Coalition of Southern Oregon (HCCSO) being acknowledged in 2018 by the CEPPs International Sister Cities Program. CEPPs praised the three organizations for their collaborative efforts to support parents and families in line with the Childhood and Early Parenting Principles.



The resolution also explains that CEPPs align with the State of Oregon’s multiyear early learning plan, set out in the Early Learning Council’s 2019 “Raise Up Oregon” report, and encourages state agencies to fully engage with the cross-sector approach called for in “Raise Up Oregon” and CEPPs.

“We’re grateful to Rep. Marsh for her strong support for all efforts towards positive parenting and healthy families,” Program Manager Peter Buckley said. “CEPPs in an international movement that is great to be part of, and ‘Raise Up Oregon’ provides a roadmap for real progress in our state.”
