Environment Rating Scales (ERS) Introduction and Module Trainings:

What are the Environment Rating Scales (ERS) and how do they contribute to continuous quality improvement in early learning programs? The ERS are quality indicators on which Oregon's Spark rating is based. Whether or not you are currently participating in Spark, intend to, or are just interested in learning more, the ERS can help you improve the quality of your early learning environment, understand what quality looks like in an early childhood program and why. **In order to take the more in-depth Set 2 ERS Module trainings, you must plan to take the Set 1 Intro to ERS on January 7 or February 17.**

Licensing for new providers:

We will be holding trainings remotely. Currently, as long as you complete the required online Part 1 of the Introduction to Child Care Health & Safety and online CPR, you will not be out of compliance. You will need to complete the in-person portion as soon as that is possible.
