 Mission: Improve family capacity to be self-sustaining while creating a safe and permanent living environment for children.




Mandatory Reporting

Oregon state law mandates that workers in certain professions must make reports if they have reasonable cause to suspect abuse or neglect. These people are called mandatory reporters and they are a crucial link in the system to protect Oregon's most vulnerable citizens.

Oregon Statute 419B.005





Is a parent using substances child abuse?



Not all substance use impacts child safety

- Understand the type of drug, frequency of use, and behavioral impact on parent
- Consider accessibility of the drug to children
- Impact to child safety





Is spanking child abuse?



Spanking, if it is reasonable, is not abuse

We know that spanking increases risk of negative behavioral, cognitive, and psychosocial and emotional outcomes for children

Oregon Safety Model

Call of Concern

 Our Screening Department determines if an assessment is opened. If not, process ends here.

Assessment

 An investigation takes place in which child safety is determined, and the level of services needed for child's safety. If child is safe, process ends here. Services may continue if needed.

Open Case

- In-Home case is when the child remain in the care if their parent/s, but DHS has temporary legal custody of child. Services are provided to help parents make safe choices for their child.
- Out-of-Home case is when children are placed in foster care.
 Services are provided to help parents make safe choices for their child.

Decision is Made by Juvenile Court A judge decides custody of children. When parent are safe again, children are placed back in their care and services continue until they are no longer needed.

Adoption or Permanent Placement Plan •If parents continue to be unsafe, a permanent placement plan is made.



Open Case vs Open Assessment

Open Assessment: this is an investigation into the safety of children.

 Open Case: The child has been determined unsafe through the assessment process. The family is working with service providers and has an ongoing caseworker.



Services

- DHS partners with various community service providers in an effort to give parents the knowledge, skills, and resources to help them make safe choices for their children.
- These services are provided until the parents are able to maintain safety without the services and DHS is able to close the case.


