We serve children ages birth to Kinder with developmental delays or disabilities.

IFSP Process

- 1. Referral
- 2. Evaluation
- 3. Eligibility
- 4. Creation of IFSP
- 5. Interventions

Who can refer a child?

- Families
- Pediatricians
- Childcare Providers
- Preschool Staff
- Other Community Agencies
 (DHS, relief nurseries, etc.)



*A parent has the right to consent or refuse an evaluation and EI/ECSE services. "Parent" refers to a birth or adoptive parent, legal guardian, or surrogate parent.

Referral Process

- After referral is made, the parent is called by intake team to schedule 1 or 2 evaluations (dependent on number of concerns and needs of child).
- Parent is sent an AEPS Family Report (a developmental questionnaire) and Health History form by email or mail to complete prior to evaluation. They also receive procedural safeguards (parents' rights).
- Parent signs consent to evaluate.



Evaluation Timelines

- El Timeline (birth 3): 45 calendar days to complete initial IFSP
- ECSE Timeline (3 5): 60 school days to complete the evaluation and eligibility determination. Another 30 school days to complete IFSP.



Evaluation Process

 Children birth to age 3: tested in all areas (cognitive, fine motor, gross motor, social/emotional, and expressive and receptive language)

 Children ages 3-5: Tested only in areas specified as concerns – make sure to list ALL possible concerning areas!!!





Evaluation Process

- Conducted by a multidisciplinary team representing 2 or more separate disciplines or professions
 - Must use at least 1 normreferenced, standardized test and at least 1 additional procedure (our program often uses the AEPS)
 - Must have at least 1 20-minute observation of child and review of previous testing/medical data.
- Conducted in child's native language

Eligibility Process

A child is eligible if...

- Medical (El only): There is a diagnosed physical or mental condition that has a high probability of resulting in developmental delay –or-
 - Categorical: They meet the minimum criteria for one of the following disability categories: autism spectrum disorder, deafblindness, hearing impairment, orthopedic impairment, traumatic brain injury, visual impairment –or-



Developmental Delay (next slide)

Eligibility Process...

A child is eligible under Developmental Delay through the following criteria using the Bell Curve...

Criteria:

El: 2 standard deviations below the mean

in 1 area of development or 1.5

standard deviations at or below the mean in 2 areas

of development **ECSE:** 1.5 standard

deviations at or below the mean in 2 or more areas.



Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) Process...

 After eligibility is established, an IFSP is drafted with a team including the parents, service providers, service coordinator, specialists, teachers, etc.

Main Components Include:

Present levels of development
(along with strengths, concerns of parents, health information, etc.)
Goals in areas of need/family priority
Adaptations/Modifications (ECSE)
Placement (ECSE)
Services
Family outcomes



Early Intervention (0-3)

- Services from birth through 3 are in the family's natural environment, usually being the home or the child's childcare facility.
- El specialists use a primary service provider model to coach parents in areas of need.
- All related services provided in home or natural environment



Early Childhood Special Education

- From ages 3-5
- Services are provided in an educational environment
- All related services provided in the child's educational environment



ECSE Placements

Different placements include:

 Site-based classrooms – children with multiple and significant needs who need individualized specialized support in order to learn

Autism STAR classrooms – for children who are significantly impacted by autism

PALSS (Preschool Acquisition

 of Language and Social Skills) –
 for children who have
 language delays and a

delay in another area



ECSE Placements cont.

- Speech or phonology groups
- Individual speech therapy
- Community classrooms
 Site child already attends
 Head Start
 - -Preschool Promise
 - -Family Nurturing Center
 - -Contracted preschool sites



Related Specialists

Other specialists may work with child depending on needs:

- Speech and Language Pathologist (SLP) speech needs
- Occupational Therapist (OT) fine motor and sensory needs
- Physical Therapist (PT) gross motor needs
