Treatment Offerings



Clinically Focused Program Tailored to Each Individual's Needs

- Medication Assisted Treatment
 - Methadone or Buprenorphine/Naloxone (brand name “Suboxone”)
 - Counseling focused, medication is only used to stabilize patient and “assist” the effectiveness of counseling efforts
 - Generally a 2-5 year program for success



- Patient Safety
 - Choosing a Program
 - Low and Slow, Steady State
 - ECG
- Infectious Disease Reduction
 - Education
 - Testing
- Improving Mental Health and Physical Well-Being
 - Assessments
 - Medical Referrals
 - Annual Reviews

Methadone



- Synthetic Opioid – Long acting opioid agonist
- Binds to mu receptors to suppress withdrawal and cravings
- Safe and effective when used with appropriate safeguards, counseling, and case management
- Reduces adverse consequences of illicit use
 - Cellulitis
 - HIV Infections
 - Criminal Behavior

Buprenorphine



- Synthetic opioid – partial agonist and antagonist
- May produce withdrawal due to antagonistic properties
- Long lasting
- Similar rates of treatment retention and abstinence



Recovery Model (Holistic Care)

- **Individualized Treatment**
 - Assessment Tools
 - Coordination with Medical Team and Community Providers
- **Case Management**
 - Meeting their basic needs to help them confront their addiction
 - Mental Health Referrals
- **Family Integration**
 - Strong families create strong people and better outcomes
- **Relapse Prevention**
 - Discharge Planning for Clinical and Medical Intervention

MATRIX Model



- New to ORTC Facilities
- Intensive Outpatient Treatment for continued illicit use
 - All substances
- 5 group topics weekly
 - Family Education, Community Support, Early Recovery, Relapse Prevention, Social Support

Community Services



- Coordination with medical providers: Primary care, Cardiologist, Pain management
- Panel discussions, personalized outreach, fairs and other events.
- HIV Alliance partnership
- Max's Mission
- Oregon Recovers
