

learning began in October 2020.




HOW WERE COURSES TAUGHT?

Courses were taught via Canvas, an online Learning Management System. Canvas provided an asynchronous, self-paced course, with facilitated discussion boards.

Five modules in five weeks with a balance of research, theory, and practical application.

HOW WERE ENROLLEES RECRUITED?



COURSE OFFERINGS

Six topics were selected based on input from the thirteen-member school districts in SOESD.

ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES (ACES) 101

Understand ACEs and identify the impact ACEs can have on a student's social, emotional, and academic development.

TRAUMA INFORMED PRACTICES (TIP) 101

Define trauma and understand how the brain is impacted, as well as the importance of educator well-being in dealing with students' trauma.

EQUITY 101:

Institutional Racism/Biases/Micro Aggressions

To assist in providing equitable opportunities through understanding of definitions and information about equity concepts.

SOCIO-EMOTIONAL LEARNING (SEL) 101

Learn the five key competencies in SEL and gain a basic understanding of the research supporting the application of social and emotional learning (SEL) in the school setting.

BUILDING RESILIENCE IN MENTAL & BEHAVIORAL HEALTH (BRMBH)

Understand definitions for mental and behavioral health and learn about ways to build resiliency and protective factors when working with students.

UNIVERSAL DESIGN FOR LEARNING (UDL) 101

UDL is NOT a program or curriculum. Rather, it is an approach to curriculum design that can help meet the needs of ALL students. (launched Summer 2021)
