# director's message

### THANK YOU TO OUR VOLUNTEERS - YOU DO MAKE A DIFFERENCE!

Our Parks Division manages 766 acres of parkland and open space that includes 19 parks within the City of Ashland. We also co-manage 53 miles of trails in and around the city. Our Recreation Division hosts several annual events and offers recreation programs. The Recreation Division oversees The Grove, North Mountain Park Nature Center, Oak Knoll Golf Course and two seasonal facilities: Ashland Rotary Centennial Ice Rink and Daniel Meyer Memorial Pool. Our Senior Services Division also hosts events, offers support services and programming, manages Ashland Senior Center, and hosts Rogue Valley Council of Governments (RVCOG) to provide senior meals through the Food & Friends program. We could not provide all of these services and maintain parkland without the help of our volunteers!

Our Commission, established in 1908 by City Charter, is led by five elected officials who volunteer their time and life experiences to guide the mission and goals of APRC. Our newest Commissioner, Jim Bachman, was appointed this spring to fill the seat vacated by longtime Commissioner, Mike Gardiner. Jim will fill this vacancy through the end of this year, and he brings a high level of experience and knowledge. Mike Gardiner is sorely missed after his 18 years on the Commission.

Our Volunteer in Parks (VIP) Program was created in 2011. Since the inception of the program, our volunteers have logged over 128,000 hours! Volunteer projects range from park maintenance work parties, to teaching environmental education to youth across the Rogue Valley, to computer support at our Senior Center. With volunteer support we are able to host multiple annual events such as the Rogue Valley Bike Swap, and Bear Creek Salmon Festival. Twenty-one local organizations, businesses and schools have adopted 17 parks to help to maintain them. In fact, it is with the help of volunteers that our parks are pesticide-free. It takes a lot of human power to pull weeds!

Volunteering is good for all in our community. It benefits the person doing the volunteer work and all organizations who reap the benefits of their work and dedication.

### A Tribute to Volunteer & Friend Mike Hersh

With a heavy heart, we say farewell to Mike Hersh, one of the most dedicated volunteers our community has ever known. We would like to acknowledge Mike and his enormous service to the community. Our staff cherish fond memories of Mike, who for 20 years delivered our interoffice mail, volunteered since 2006 with the RVCOG Food & Friends program at Ashland Senior Center and served on the Ashland Senior Advisory Committee since 2018. Mike also volunteered for many other organizations in Ashland over the last 20 years, including at ScienceWorks, Oregon Shakespeare Festival, the Ashland Independent Film Festival, just to name a few! Our hearts go out to Mike's family and friends.

# Irrigation of Parks during a Drought

Our parks may look a little different this summer as we prioritize where we will water and where we will not. Historically, Talent Irrigation District (TID) water is used for irrigation in our largest parks during the summer months. In 2021, TID was only available intermittently and cut off early in June. This year could prove to be more severe than 2021 and it is feasible that TID water will not be available at all this summer. Irrigating with potable city water is not a viable option for all parks. In order to keep expenses down and conserve water, it will be necessary to reduce irrigation in many of our parks. You can expect some of our parks to look different this summer. Please bear with us as we navigate this drought. We will do our best to conserve water while continuing to provide outdoor recreation spaces.


### Meet Carolyn Singh - Nature Play Area Host
