

Dan grew up immersed in American Indian Movement culture and his traditional ways. His father is a spiritual leader and his uncle founded West Coast AIM. He has traveled extensively with his father learning about the Red Road, a Native American Spiritual path of purpose rooted in living in the right relationship with all beings with whom we share this Earth. He eventually landed on the reservation where he participated and held an officer's position in ceremony. Dan teaches from the indigenous perspective, focusing on decolonization, healthy thinking, and "returning to being a human being." - Dan


